In the education area, staff and student anxieties abound in areas of teaching, learning and training.

Therefore, a research-informed <u>Higher Education Conference</u> will be held next year in Sri Lanka on "**Helping educators and students reduce and manage performance anxieties"** (for dates *Abstract Guidelines*: see https://www.slaihee.org/ - note: 'Guidelines' link is at bottom of Announcement). It has a Research Abstract submission deadline of 03 March 2025.

To help university staff to plan and prepare Research Abstracts on this related Conference theme (i.e., which activities to identify - plan - do, to help relieve such staff/student anxieties), a <u>first Workshop</u> (WS) is being conducted on <u>17 December 2024 (Tuesday, 1 to 4 p.m)</u>. After that, staff would have a 2-month period to try out plans in class or training situations to collect research results, including refining work already done. Then, the second WS, to help draft Research Abstracts based on those results, will be on 18 February 2025 (Tuesday, 1 to 4 p.m).

Research has to show the 'anxiety' area of concern, procedure and activities you then used to address it, the observed or measured data that showed the effects of what you had <u>carried out</u> on learners or teachers and any future redesign (e.g. in student/ staff / teacher training / redesigning).
